
For this scholarship, students must be:

HOW DO I ANSWER THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO HOLINESS ? by Fr. Addisalem Mekonnen

Everyone is called to holiness; to bear witness to Jesus Christ with our whole being through our daily words and actions. The Holy Spirit guides us to mature in our faith and love for Jesus with our Lady who is 'Mediatrix of All Graces.' There are many spiritualties that help Christians become fully mature in Christ. St. Louis de Montfort's **"True Devotion to Mary"** is a spirituality in which one learns to have an intimate relationship with the Blessed Mother and the Cross of Christ, living out in practical ways our baptismal promises.

Holiness is a pilgrimage toward heaven. Just as the Israelites journeyed towards the Promised Land, we follow our Lord to Calvary and then onward toward the empty tomb. This pilgrimage is truly a family affair because it gathers us together as one family so we may constantly encounter Jesus through the Sacraments and through each other.

Holiness is having an intimate relationship based on the sacrificial love of the Blessed Trinity which we can imitate because we are relational beings. Holy Scriptures especially the Gospels reveal that this sacrificial love, imitated by surrounding our will to His, is pleasing to God.

In St. Alphonsus Maria de Liguori's book **"Uniformity with God's Will"** he wrote: "Perfection is founded entirely on the love of God: 'Charity is the bond of perfection;' and perfect love of God means the complete union of our will with God's."

St Francis de Sales in "Introduction to the Devout Life" explains how everyone is called to holiness and that doing the will of our Father within the context of our particular vocation is life itself. The Will of the Father is to be faithful to our duties in life within our particular vocation. The Legion of Mary is a lay organization that helps the laity serve Jesus through the spirit of Mary in everyone we meet. I love the Legion of Mary because it is based upon St Louis de Montfort's spirituality through which I heard the call to the priesthood. The Legion of Mary has greatly helped me grow in my maturity as a Catholic and has added significantly to my seminary formation. It has been truly a miracle of God. The Legion of Mary is a "lay apostolic association of Catholics who, with the sanction of the Church and under the powerful leadership of Mary Immaculate, we serve the Church through our neighbors on a voluntary basis in about 170 countries." The mission of the Legion of Mary is the glory of God through the holiness of its members by a formation of prayer and active cooperation in Mary's and the Church's work. The unit of the Legion of Mary is called a Praesidium, which holds a weekly meeting, where prayer is integrated with reports and discussions. Persons who wish to join the Legion must apply for membership in a Praesidium. The Legion perceives as its main concerns the spiritual and social welfare of each individual. The members participate in the life of the parish through visitation of families, the sick, both in their homes and in hospitals and through collaboration in every apostolic and missionary undertaking sponsored by the parish. Every legionary is required to carry out a weekly apostolic work in the spirit of faith and in union with Mary.

WHO WE ARE

The Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary is the largest and oldest continually existent, predominantly African-American lay Catholic organization.

Founded more than 100 years ago, it was formed to provide opportunities for Catholic Action to men of color to be actively involved in their faith by living the Gospel message. The Knights of Peter Claver membership now includes the entire family and offers opportunities to engage in a variety of church and community service projects, and support national and international charitable appeals.

By continuing the work of our patron saint, Father Peter Claver, members are led to deeper spirituality and a greater sense of purpose for their parish and community. The volunteerpowered Knights, Ladies and Juniors aim to provide support to the local community through service work and charitable endeavors.




THE ORDER

Founded November 7, 1909, the Knights of Peter Claver delivered spiritual direction and fellowship at a time when the black populace was growing in the Catholic Church, yet struggling for acceptance. Four Josephite fathers and three laymen founded the Knights of Peter Claver in Mobile, Alabama and, at the time, the group was termed "the most important movement for colored Catholics that has taken place for many a day."

Soon after the organization's founding, the Knights became a more inclusive group with the establishment of a Junior Knights program in 1917. Women then joined the group, beginning with the Ladies Auxiliary in 1922 and the Junior Daughters in 1930.

Headquartered in New Orleans, the Knights of Peter Claver currently has units – Councils (men), Courts (women), as well as Junior Branches and Courts (youth boys and girls) operating in Archdioceses and Dioceses across the United States and on San Andres Island in Colombia, South America.



HOW MANY BOOKS ARE IN THE BIBLE? ALTHOUGH THE WORD BIBLE MEANS "BOOK," THE BIBLE IS ACTUALLY A LIBRARY OF BOOKS GATHERED TOGETHER INTO ONE SACRED VOLUME. THE BIBLE CONSISTS OF 73 BOOKS — 46 IN THE OLD TESTAMENT AND 27 IN THE NEW TESTAMENT. AS YOU MAY KNOW, PROTESTANT BIBLES ONLY INCLUDE 39 OLD TESTAMENT BOOKS.
