

My Brothers & Sisters

As you know, Juneteenth is a Federal Holiday and a holiday in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. We are thankful that Archbishop Perez recognizes the importance. Many enjoyed the day off but did not fully understand the history. Juneteenth is a holiday commemorating the end of slavery in the United States. It is also called Emancipation Day or Juneteenth Independence Day. The name "Juneteenth" references the date of the holiday, combining the words "June" and "nineteenth." Similar to Black History Month, and other important anniversaries to Black Americans, it is important to acknowledge it as an American holiday, even if you do not celebrate it. On June 19, 1865 the last group of enslave people were freed. Their freedom was bittersweet and came two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation was issued in 1863. I encourage you to reflect and rejoice on African American successes and achievements.


July 4th has become synonymous with family reunions, cookouts, fireworks, parades and more importantly freedom.

As we celebrate our nation's 246th anniversary, let us reflect on and commit to living the ideals upon which our nation was born: "...all are created equal with certain unalienable Rights including Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness."

Officially known as Independence Day, the Fourth of July commemorates the birth of the United States. On July 2, 1776, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence, declaring freedom from Great Britain. On July 4, after two days of revisions, including removal of the strong denunciation of slavery, delegates from the thirteen colonies ratified the Declaration of Independence. The first annual commemoration of Independence Day took place July 4, 1777, in Philadelphia.


FR. JEFFREY ROTT

The Office for Black Catholics welcomes Fr. Jeffrey Rott as the new Pastor at St. Raymond of Penafort. Archbishop Perez has entrusted him to serve this historic community. He was ordained in 2009 and served as a parish priest at SS. Simon and Jude in West Chester, St. Jude in Chalfont, St. Laurence in Upper Darby and Epiphany of Our Lord in Plymouth Meeting. He was also the chaplain to Pope John Paul High School in Royersford.

Fr. Rott was born in Auburn, New York, the same town where Harriet Tubman spent much of her life and ultimately was laid to rest. Most of his childhood years were spent near Syracuse New York and eventually moved to Collegeville during his Junior Year of High School.He attended Bloomsburg University, earned a degree in accounting, and worked in the field for 3 years prior to entering the Seminary.

He had the privilege of visiting many sacred sites in our Catholic Tradition including St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico, and Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal. I had the privilege of celebrating Mass on top of Mount Calvary in Jerusalem at Church of the Holy Sepulcher. As a seminarian, he served at St. Martin de Porres Parish from the summer of 2006 to the spring of 2007. He enjoyed the prayerfulness of the community every Sunday at the 10am Mass during that year. Fr. Rott asked

for your prayers as he begins to serve the St. Raymond of Penafort community.


